Home style boarding house

Meru Desa Park Boarding House consists of two secure, two storey, adjoining town houses on a gated housing development close to the school campus. It has separate sleeping accommodation upstairs for girls on one side and boys on the other. There are large, joint social, dining and study areas downstairs as well as two kitchens and laundry areas. Outside is a small, but well-equipped play area with a table tennis table and a basketball hoop.

A family atmosphere

Creating a home away from home falls to our experienced Head of Boarding, Madam Pang and a team of tutors. Through their care and guidance we provide a safe and secure environment where children from different backgrounds can thrive and learn what true International Mindedness means in practice. Learning to live away from home teaches children independence, resilience and tolerance as well as an understanding of the needs of others.

Student voice

Listening to our boarders is important. There is a half termly meeting of the Boarding House Council which is overseen by Nur Asyitah Idris, Senior CoOrdinating Tutor. In addition there is also a 'suggestions box' where boarders can make anonymous contributions if they are too shy to speak in front of a larger audience.

All the right ingredients

Evening meals are an important time for the boarding house community to get together over a nutritious meal and enjoy each other's company. They are joined for their meal by an 'on duty' tutor with whom they can discuss the day's issues, make suggestions about the running of the house and seek academic support during the post meal study period.

A good mix of work and play

We believe in the old English proverb, "All work and no play makes Jack a dull boy." This means providing a well-rounded, holistic education ensuring children get the right balance of study and 'play.' Friday nights are activity night, for example, watching a movie or going bowling. There are also opportunities at the weekends to play sport, be creative, visit Ipoh city centre, or simply relax.
